

TRIAL IS JUSTIFIED

"The evidence already given at the trial in Israel more than amply justifies the action of the Government of Israel in placing Eichmann on trial," the General Secretary of the Jewish Council to Combat Fascism and Anti-semitism, Mr. Platz said.

"Already the trial has helped to alert the conscience of the world to the fearful consequences of fascism.

"For instance, in Germany it has caused liberal and Labor newspapers to call attention to the existence of neo-Nazi movements and former Nazis in leading positions and demand action against them.

"Throughout the world the trial has brought home to the generation that has grown up since the end of the world war the full horrors of Hitlerism.

established within the last few years between Israel and some of the newly-created states in Africa and Asia as among the greatest achievements in the short history of the State of Israel, and as giving expression to one of the basic tenets of the Jewish concept of universal brotherhood and peace."

EQUALITY

He emphasised that the aid of the more developed countries to the new African states should be offered in a sentiment of equality and solidarity and not as charity, thus enabling the discharge of moral and material duties towards the maintenance and strengthening of brotherhood and co-operation among the nations.

Presiding at the meeting was Dr. Salo Baron, Professor of Jewish History, Columbia University, who recently appeared as a witness at the Eichmann trial.

Earlier in the meeting, Dr. Israel Wechsler, internationally known neurologist and Jewish communal leader was elected President of the Conference on Jewish Social Studies. Dr. Wechsler, consulting neurologist at Mt. Sinai Hospital of New York, is a member of the Board of Governors of the Hebrew University of Israel and a past President of the American Friends of the Hebrew University. He succeeds the late Professor Koppel Pinson, of Queens College.
