

World reaction

VIENNA, (JTA), Monday: The newspaper "Arbeiterzeitung" reported that there had been a plan by former Nazis to kidnap Nahum Goldmann during one of his visits, in exchange for Eichmann.

The plot was initiated, according to the paper, by Alois Brunner ex-Austrian Gestapo officer who worked with Eichmann. Brunner was sentenced to death in his absence and lived in Damascus till last year.

German Intelligence got wind of the plan and arrested a number of people in Germany and deported them, says the paper.

● **BUENOS AIRES (UPI):** Two Molotov Cocktails were thrown against the Union De Israel Jewish School here late last Saturday.

It was the first anti-Semitic outrage since the execution of Adolf Eichmann. Flames damaged a door and some windows before the incendiary bombs were extinguished.

Unknown persons fired from a passing automobile at the Office of the ZIM-Israel Navigation Company at the corner of Viamonte and Talcahuano with a burst from a machine gun.

At 8.15 a.m. the shots shattered the windows of the steamship line's offices. Ten nine millimeter shots were counted.

Meanwhile the Tacuara Nationalist Movement which is notoriously anti-Semitic, said in a communique that Eichmann's execution was a "assassination" for the purpose of vengeance.

"We protest the surprise execution of Adolf Eichmann after a judicial farce without

any legal basis, which objectively, constitutes an assassination which has no other justification than vengeance."

Tacuara also deplored "the violation of our sovereignty perpetrated by the State of Israel" and described the Argentine Government's attitude in the affair as "shameful."

Tacuara is a youth organisation, sympathetic to the Peronistas, which scrawls anti-Semitic slogans on walls, in the subways, etc. and has been blamed for outrages on Synagogues and Jewish Schools.

GUARDED

Federal police increased the guard at the Israeli Embassy and placed guards at principal Jewish Temples shortly after news of the execution.

But reports from both the capital and interior of the country indicated that there had been no anti-demonstrations.

Nationalist groups during the past couple of weeks have increased their anti-Semitic activities, attacking synagogues, and Jewish schools and institutions.

● **TOKYO, (UPI):** Japanese newspapers published

without comment on the front pages of their noon editions reports of the execution of Adolf Eichmann.

Kyodo News Agency ran an interpretative story tracing the background of Eichmann's case but offered no opinion.

The Agency pointed out it was the first execution since the birth of the new State of Israel and that it occurred on the 416th day after the opening of the trial.

● **LISBON, (UPI):** Two unidentified young men placed a smoke-bomb in the Israeli Consulate here.

The incident was understood to be a protest against the hanging of Adolf Eichmann. The smoke-bomb caused no damage to the building.

● **BOLZANO, Italy, (UPI):** Four Swastikas were painted on walls in the Val Pusteria area in the German speaking Alto Adige (South Tyrol) region.
